Dr. Edward (Eddie) Fergus is a Professor of Urban Education in the School of Arts and Sciences at Rutgers University – Newark. Prior to joining Rutgers University, he was Associate Professor of Urban Education and Policy at Temple University, Assistant Professor of Educational Leadership and Policy at New York University, and Deputy Director of the Metropolitan Center for Urban Education at New York University. As a former high school social studies teacher, program evaluator, and community school program director, he is continuously approaching research with an attention to its application within educational settings. His work is on the intersection of

educational policy and outcomes with a specific focus on Black and Latino boys' academic and social engagement outcomes, disproportionality in special education and suspensions, and school climate conditions. He has published more than four dozen articles, book chapters, evaluation reports, and five books.
